Background

The proposed greenfield project aims to establish an electric mobility unit that will develop and operate an integrated and sustainable public transport system within Lumbini Province. The project aims to promote sustainable, reliable and efficient bus transport services by transitioning from fossil fuelled buses to electric buses, reducing fossil fuel consumption, greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions and air pollution within the bus transport sector in Lumbini province. With the province being developed as a major tourist and religious centre, the service route for the electric buses will service the major landmarks in the province.


