# Promoting Investment in Ginger Value Chain

### Background

The FAO's HiHi initiative, launched in October 2019, focuses on agricultural transformation and rural development to address poverty and hunger (SDGs 1 and 2). Nepal, identified as a priority country since 2021, is advancing agrifood systems through evidence-based strategies. Key investments in commodities like Large Cardamom, Ginger, Highland Potato, and Timur were highlighted at the FAO Investment Forum in 2022, with Nepal slated to present again in 2024. This project specifically emphasizes the cultivation of ginger, underscoring its critical role in Nepal's agricultural strategy.



#### **Project Rationale**

#### **Contribution to Agri- GDP:**

- Spices contribute 5.3% to agri-GDP, with ginger constituting half by volume
- 246 thousand holdings produced 279 thousand metric tons (2021)

#### **Global Standing:**

- Nepal ranks 4th globally in ginger production
- Trade Policy and Nepal Trade Integration Strategy prioritize ginger for exports

#### **Geographical and Varietal Insights:**

- Cultivated across Siwalik and Mahabharat ranges
- Varieties: Nashe (fiber-rich), Boshe (low-fiber); potential for geographical indications

#### **Potential Growth Areas:**

- Opportunity to increase cultivation area and double yields from 12.74 MT/ha.
- Allowing for economies of scale
- Export prices of ginger are nearly one-half US\$ per kg
- This price is lucrative, enhancing profitability

#### Advantages and Opportunities:

- Favorable geo-climatic conditions enhance quality
- Significant income source for small farming families, fostering inclusive development
- Scope for inter-cropping, organic production, and diverse processing

#### Value Chain Dynamics and Investments:

- High value per unit area; suitable for marginal lands
- Employment-intensive, impacting SDG targets positively
- · Distribution of costs: Production, marketing, exports, processing

Enhances income and empowers communities via ginger cultivation



Increases farmer income through value-added processing and packaging



Expands market access and improves pricing for smallholder producers



Investments lead to higher ginger yields and economic gains
