Background

Metropolitan cities have jurisdiction over public parking resources and can determine how to best manage these parking facilities. Unmanaged parking causes congestion, accidents, environmental pollution, and obstruction to fire-fighting operations. The proposed project for the construction of multi-layered vertical parking at Patandhoka, Jawalakhel and Lamachaur will cater to the needs of vehicular parking. It intends to improve the overall parking condition by providing better services, limiting the flow of vehicles into the core area and reducing the number of vehicles parked at roadside.


